

## MFL (French) Curriculum

## Foreword:

Prior to September 2020, Netherfield Primary School delivered Mandarin (using external providers) as its MFL. However, upon review of the MFL curriculum it was decided to move over to the teaching of French for the following reasons:

- The school could not conduct an effective MFL quality assurance programme of the teaching / learning of Mandarin.
- In teaching / learning Mandarin, there was no progression for the pupils when leaving Netherfield and moving into Key Stage 3.
- French is the initial MFL taught in Year 7 at Carlton Le Willows (the secondary school that the vast majority of Netherfield pupils progress to). Previously, ex Netherfield pupils had been disadvantaged by their lack of knowledge in French when starting at Carlton Le Willows.

The teaching of French was originally due to commence in September 2020. However, due to the Covid 19 epidemic, the subsequent lockdowns and the reprioritisation of subjects resulting from them, the teaching of French at Netherfield actually began in the April 2021 Summer Term.

## **Intent Statement:**

Netherfield Primary School intends to use the Language Angels scheme of work (appropriately adapted to the needs of its pupils) and resources to ensure we offer a relevant, broad and vibrant French curriculum that will inspire and excite our pupils using a wide variety of topics and themes. All pupils will be expected to achieve their full potential by encouraging high expectations and excellent standards in their French language learning - the ultimate aim being that pupils will feel willing and able to continue studying French beyond Key Stage 2.

The intent is that all content will be continuously updated and reviewed annually, creating a dynamic programme of study that will be clearly outlined in both long-term and short-term planning. This will ensure that, commencing in Year 3, the French knowledge of our pupils progresses within each academic year and is extended year upon year throughout Key Stage 2 and in so doing, will always be relevant and in line with meeting national DfE requirements.

The four key language learning skills; **listening**, **speaking**, **reading** and **writing** will be taught and all necessary **grammar** will be covered in an age-appropriate way across Key Stage 2. This will enable pupils to use and apply their learning in a variety of contexts, laying down solid foundations for future language learning and also helping the children improve overall attainment in other subject areas. In addition, the children will be taught how to look up and research language they are unsure of and they will have a bank of reference materials to help them with their spoken and written tasks going forward. This bank of reference materials will develop into a reference library to help pupils recall and build on previous knowledge throughout their primary school language learning journey.

The intent is that all pupils will develop a genuine interest and positive curiosity about foreign languages, finding them enjoyable and stimulating. Learning a second language will also offer pupils the opportunity to explore relationships between language and identity, develop a deeper understanding of other cultures and the world around them with a better awareness of self, others and cultural differences. The intention is that they will be working towards becoming life-long language learners.

## **Curriculum Notes:**

Throughout the Language Angels programme, lessons / activities are based on one-hour lessons per week. However, at Netherfield, French is timetabled for 30 mins per week / per Key Stage 2 class. Therefore, the activities highlighted in the following curriculum map will usually run over two 30 min lessons. The first lesson of each activity will comprise of teacher input and topic delivery, with the second lesson comprising of a brief recap, pupil task and finally a plenary.

The topics indicated have been selected in such a way as to build on the pupils' previous French knowledge / prior learning as they progress through Key Stage 2. Also, the topics have been placed in particular year groups to maximise cross curricular links and compliment the pupils' learning in other subjects, as much as possible.

Υ5	Intermediate Language Teaching	Learning Intention: Children will be able to tell someone the members and their ages for a family (factual or fictitious). They continue working with numbers (reaching 100) to enable them to say the age of various family members.
