**Netherfield Primary School PE Sport Grant Report 2021-22**

Sports funding is being jointly provided by the Department for Education and sees money going directly to primary schools to spend on improving the quality of sport and PE for all of their children. The money can only be spent on sport and PE provision in schools.

In a very different year, we expanded our swimming provision across two years as part of a longer term approach for improving outcomes for our children. 25% of our Year 6 were confident in two strokes (25m) and 60% were considered 'confidence growing' by our LA instructors. Our swimming now takes place across Y4 and Y6, with the school adding the additional investment required for Y6.
