

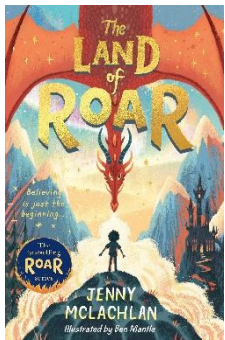
Year 5 Newsletter

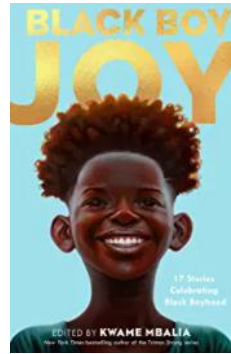
In maths, the children will be working on multiplication and division, and fractions, decimals and percentages.

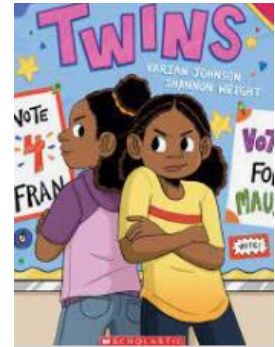
Internet safety at home

Times Tables

As the children are now working on a multiplication and division unit, it is exceptionally important that they can recall their multiplication and division facts quickly and accurately.

You can help your child make progress in maths by ensuring they know their times tables. Practising on Times Tables Rockstars for 5 minutes every day should help them do this!

Other information

- Year 5 PE is on a Tuesday afternoon. Please make sure your child comes to school in appropriate clothing for PE that day. It is particularly important that they come well dressed for what could be cold weather. Please ensure your child is not wearing earrings on this day.
- Please make sure your child brings a reusable water bottle in to school.
- Children should be reading daily at home (approximately 15 minutes). Children can record reads for no more than twice in one day.

- Home reads are counted a couple of days before the end of the half term, considering any potential reads the children could complete.
