We are pleased to welcome Mrs Evans to the Year Five team.



Times Tables

As the children are now working on a multiplication and division unit, it is exceptionally important that they can recall their multiplication and division facts quickly and accurately.

You can help your child make progress in maths by ensuring they know their times tables. Practising on Times Tables Rockstars for 5 minutes every day should help them do this!

Other information

- Year 5 PE is on a Tuesday afternoon. Please make sure your child comes to school in appropriate clothing for PE that day. It is particularly important that they come well dressed for what could be cold weather.
- Please make sure your child brings a reusable water bottle into school with their name on if possible.
- Children should be reading daily at home (approximately 15 minutes). Children can record reads for no more than twice in one day but can write these into their diaries themselves.
- Homework and spellings are sent home on Fridays.
- Home reads are counted at the end of every half term. If you would like to count the children's reads throughout the half term, that's fine!
