Times Tables

As the children are now working on a multiplication and division unit, it is exceptionally important that they can recall their multiplication and division facts quickly and accurately.

You can help your child make progress in maths by ensuring they know their times tables. Practising on Times Tables Rockstars for 5 minutes every day should help them do this!

Other information

- Year 5 PE is on a Tuesday afternoon. Please make sure your child comes to school in appropriate clothing for PE that day. It is particularly important that they come well dressed for what could be cold weather.
- Please encourage your child to read at home daily. Even 10 minutes of reading before bed makes a significant impact on their progress in reading.
