This term we will write about Polar Animals and a narrative polar story. We now have 4 lessons a week on spelling rules. Many children struggle with spellings so we practise them daily and hope children practise at home too! Opportunities to spell out loud in game style scenarios really helps memory and cognition. Knowing all the most frequently used words really helps confidence and enables children to focus on new spellings and the content of their writing instead. Can your child spell all the Y1 and 2 common exception words?



Reading



Your children's fluency and reading for meaning is really improving and this term more children will be included in our Whole Class Reading sessions three times a week. Please continue to read to them and with them at home. The books we send home are sharply focused to your child's reading ability so please do read these at home alongside other books chosen for pleasure.
